Upcoming grant for local EOC improvements ** NOW broadened to the Local Emergency Management and EOC Improvement Grant**

- o Going to be released in September
- o Can be used for EOC or shelter as well as other EM projects (i.e. training)
- o Will require 50% match, ARPA funds can be used

Max is working on an official LEMP template for hot weather/cooling shelter planning

B. Marks pointed out that the REMC hasn't had enough people to reach quorum or officially "form". He suggested that towns that don't participate should face consequences, or get/pay Fire Chiefs involved.

M. Kennedy said that he didn't foresee a system with penalties, but VEM is actively working on how to incentivize municipalities beyond just grants. The involvement of first responders was certainly the goal, but how to provide the money is a challenge.

A. L'Roe said he would do more to reach out to ACFA (and welcomed voting members that joined the call) and do more to reach out to EMS agencies about ways to represent multiple municipalities.

D.Dibiase asked whether the REMC could appoint a representative for municipalities that had not, B. Marks answered that it would require a legislative change.

At this point in the meeting, the REMC had representatives from 9 communities.

12:40- Discuss and vote on purchasing REMC logo design by - (A. L'Roe)

- A. L'Roe mentioned that there has been an offer to design an Addison County REMC logo for website and materials. A. L'Roe is proposing \$2,500 of RPC funds from EMPG for this purpose. Under ACRPC procurement rules, this would qualify as an RPC micro-purchase (for contact amounts less than \$3,000) and not need to go out to bid, but A. L'Roe will put together a short RFP. T. Scanlon and D. Kuzio volunteered to be a part of subcommittee.
