Announcements

The West Central Vermont CEDS Plan Approved

A CEDS is a strategy-driven plan for regional economic development. The ACRPC, ACEDC, have worked in collaboration with partner regional planning commissions and regional development corporations in Addison, Chittenden, Orange, Rutland, and Washington counties to develop a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for West Central Vermont that meets the US Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration's (EDA) requirements. Adopting a CEDS helps our region to set a strategic course for economic development efforts. An adopted CEDS can also open opportunities for additional Federal funding to support local economic development efforts (including funding from EDA).

Vergennes Neighborhood Development Area Designation Approved

On May 22, 2023, the Downtown Development Board approved the City of Vergennes' application for a Neighborhood Development Area Designation. The designated area will be eligible for all the benefits available to a Neighborhood Development Area for as long as Vergennes' downtown designation is in effect. The DHCD team will check in with the municipality regularly to offer support, share updated information, tools, and resources related to the designation, and ensure our local contact information is up-to-date. The Town of Monkton is seeking a zoning administrator.

Monkton estimates that the job will be somewhere between 1/3rd and 1/2 a full time equivalent. People interested in applying should call the Monkton Town Clerk at 802-453-3800. Additionally, if any other municipalities within the Addison Region also need to hire a zoning administrator, Monkton would be willing to share expenses and the Addison County Regional Planning Commission would be willing to work with Communities to create a position to support those services and facilitate cooperation between its municipal members. Municipal Technical Assistance Program

As part of the State's ongoing efforts to make the most of state and federal funding and expand funding to communities who need additional assistance, the Agency of Administration in coordination with local Regional Planning Commissions is granting funds to municipalities throughout the state for Municipal Technical Assistance. These funds are intended to assist those communities with a high need for state and federal grants but lower capacity for accessing and applying for those sources. The towns of Goshen, Granville, Hancock, Panton, Waltham, and Whiting have all been pre-approved for this program based on need. Other towns will be able to apply for this opportunity separately. Creative Futures Grant Program Now Accepting Applications for Final Round of Funding

The <u>Vermont Arts Council</u> is now accepting applications for the final round of its <u>Creative Futures Grants</u> to help the creative sector recover from economic losses due to the pandemic. Room For Me Grant

Funded by the Vermont Department for Children and Families' Child Development Division, the Room For Me Grant: Expands the amount of child care capacity throughout the state of Vermont; Increases school-age slots in year-round child care programs; Increases the number of programs that accept Child Care Financial Assistance Program (CCFAP) thereby expanding opportunities for Vermont children and youth; and Supports the child care needs of Vermont families, especially in underserved communities.

Municipal Energy Resilience Program

Weatherization Repayment Assistance Program

WRAP will allow Vermont households to pay for qualifying weatherization projects like insulation and air sealing as well as heat pumps and advanced wood heating systems through a monthly charge on their utility bill that can be paid back over time. The program is open to Vermonters of all incomes and both homeowners and renters can participate in the program. **Learn more**: <u>Here</u>

NBRC Forest Economy Program (FEP) Now Open

The Northern Border Regional Commission (NBRC) has opened its 2023 Forest Economy Program (FEP) competition. The Commission will make up to \$7 million in grants available, with a maximum award of \$1 million. Transportation

Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program

The program supports the development of a comprehensive safety action plan (Action Plan) that identifies the most significant roadway safety concerns in a community and the implementation of projects and strategies to address roadway safety issues. Planning and Demonstration Grants provide Federal funds to develop, complete, or supplement a comprehensive safety action plan. Implementation Grants provide Federal funds to implement projects and strategies identified in an Action Plan to address a roadway safety problem.

Highway Safety Improvement Program Small Scale Grants

The state has rolled out a new Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) grant-for small scale projects on TOWN roads. Funding for these grants will be 100% from the State and is to cover construction only (from \$5,000-\$35,000). Projects may be combinations of any of the following: Signage, Striping, Clearing, Breakaway devices. Non-Construction projects include planning, research, and educational activities that are not directly related to construction of infrastructure improvements.

We Are Entering the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Flight Season

The EAB flight season starts on June 1st and goes through September 30th. During this time of year, EAB will be emerging from infested ash trees, logs, and firewood and seeking new host trees and mates. Moving ash materials during the flight season could spread EAB to currently

uninfested areas. Therefore, there are more stringent recommendations for moving visibly infested ash materials in Vermont's <u>Slow the Spread Recommendations</u> to protect these areas, including delaying harvesting and not moving untreated ash until after the flight season (October 1st).
