ACRPC Update

Addison County Regional Planning Commission Launches Initiatives Aimed to Address the Lack of Appropriate Housing in the Region.

The current housing shortage is a complex problem. The age, size and condition of existing stock, the cost of construction, materials and land, a lack of infrastructure in rural villages, incompatible zoning regulations and expensive regulatory processes impact the ability to create the needed housing for our communities. Despite an active network of housing support organizations and funding opportunities, many households in the region do not have access to the housing they need, often because it doesn't exist. ACRPC has pursued several projects to better understand and address the local housing crisis.


Regional Housing Survey

ACRPC's Housing Committee has developed a Regional Housing Survey with the goal of gaining a better understanding of individual communities' issues. This survey is intended to solicit feedback about individuals' current housing status, their housing plans for the future as well as their perception of the housing situation in their town. These responses will help us better understand the scope and scale of current housing

issues in our region's municipalities, such as availability, affordability (cost) and choice. With this information, we can better identify appropriate resources and programs for individual communities and work towards solutions that best address their specific housing issues. We hope to distribute this survey in July.

ACRPC ADU Guide

This past June ACRPC finalized work on a <u>Guide</u> to <u>Creating Accessory Dwelling Units</u>, a comprehensive tool for home owners interested in developing additional housing units in the home or on their property. This guide walks you through the process of planning for and managing an ADU with additional resources provided throughout. In addition, ACRPC is



working to build capacity to provide individual support for homeowners considering an ADU. Contact Adam Lougee (alougee@acrpc.org) for more information.

These projects are just two local examples of the many efforts around the state to alleviate housing issues in VT. In particular, we would like to thank our legislators for their support of the HOME act, which addresses critical housing policy reform as a mechanism to help ease Vermont's housing crisis. ACRPC's Executive Director, Adam Lougee, will be presenting a summary of the Act and what it means for communities in the Addison Region at the next ACRPC full commission meeting on July 12th. Announcements

The Town of Monkton is seeking a zoning administrator.

Monkton estimates that the job will be somewhere between 1/3rd and 1/2 a full time equivalent. People interested in applying should call the Monkton Town Clerk at 802-453-3800. Municipal Technical Assistance Program

As part of the State's ongoing efforts to make the most of state and federal funding and expand funding to communities who need additional assistance, the Agency of Administration in coordination with local Regional Planning Commissions is granting funds to municipalities throughout the state for Municipal Technical Assistance. These funds are intended to assist those communities with a high need for state and federal grants but lower capacity for accessing and applying for those sources. The towns of Goshen, Granville, Hancock, Panton, Waltham, and Whiting have all been pre-approved for this program based on need. Other towns will be able to apply for this opportunity separately. Free School Meals Bill Becomes Law

Under H.165, public schools will now be required to provide free breakfast and lunch for Vermont students, regardless of their family's income. The new law sets aside state money to reimburse schools for the costs of those meals. **Learn More**: <u>Here</u>

Last Call for Flood Resilience Projects!

https://vem.vermont.gov/flood-resilient-communities-fund

The Flood Resilient Communities Fund is an ARPA-funded program that provides up to 100% funding for projects that increase public safety and reduce water quality impacts of climate-related flood hazards. The funding is application based, with priorities for home and vacant lot purchases (along with appraisals and associated costs), floodplain restoration, dam removal, green infrastructure, and likely anything else that will reduce future flooding. This is a great chance to get projects done that otherwise couldn't- don't let it slip away! The fund has about \$8 million in remaining funds to be spent through 2026, but the window for applications is closing soon: **The final application deadline is July 31, 2023.**

Municipal Energy Resilience Program

ASSESSMENT APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

Weatherization Repayment Assistance Program

WRAP will allow Vermont households to pay for qualifying weatherization projects like insulation and air sealing as well as heat pumps and advanced wood heating systems through a monthly charge on their utility bill that can be paid back over time. The program is open to Vermonters of all incomes and both homeowners and renters can participate in the program. **Learn more**: Here

New Funding for EV Charging Available!

The Agency of Commerce and Community Development (ACCD) has contracted with Green Mountain Power (GMP) to administer a new round of the Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment Grant Program. Preapplications for the new round of funding are now available! This new round will allocate \$3 million to charging at multi-unit properties (priority given to properties with less 20 units), \$2 million to workplace charging (priority given to employers

with fewer than 100 employees), and \$2 million to EV charging at public attractions. Click here to complete the preapplication form.

Municipalities that are interested in supporting EV charging in their community can do so through the adoption of EVSE-friendly development regulations. Businesses, nonprofits, and public entities that are interested in hosting EV charging at their location, as well as EV service providers, are encouraged to complete a survey to help the state gauge interest and capacity for EV charging. Solar for All Grants

Vermont's congressional delegation, along with the head of the U.S. EPA, launched a \$7 billion grant program this week that is meant to increase access to affordable solar energy. Solar for All aims to help with two issues: transitioning away from fossil fuels and ensuring working families can afford solar energy. States, tribal governments, municipalities, and eligible non-profits can apply for the grants by September 26, 2023. **Learn More:** Here

MGT 417: Crisis Management for School-Based Incidents for Key Decision Makers

The purpose of this 2 day management/planning level course is to provide the operational-level details to support many of the topics covered in the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) approved AWR 148: Crisis Management for School-Based Incidents – Partnering Rural Law Enforcement and the Local School Systems awareness-level course. Rural schools, law enforcement, other emergency responders, and community stakeholders are often limited in their access to resources, so it is imperative that all potentially affected parties collaborate in planning, preparation, communication, response, and recovery in the event of a school-based incident. Moreover, these affected parties must come together to practice their interoperable skills through drills and exercises to ensure the strategies in place provide for an effective crisis response and collaborative recovery. With the intent of building upon the foundation of the AWR 148 course and utilizing an all-hazards approach, this two-day course will provide content instruction, develop concept-specific skills, and provide opportunities for law enforcement, school

personnel, and community stakeholders to collaboratively apply the course objectives in scenario-based applications.

We Are Entering the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Flight Season

The EAB flight season starts on June 1st and goes through September 30th. During this time of year, EAB will be emerging from infested ash trees, logs, and firewood and seeking new host trees and mates. Moving ash materials during the flight season could spread EAB to currently uninfested areas. Therefore, there are more stringent recommendations for moving

visibly infested ash materials in Vermont's <u>Slow the Spread Recommendations</u> to protect these areas, including delaying harvesting and not moving untreated ash until after the flight season (October 1st).
