Addison County Receives Rural Agency Disaster Declaration

On September 14, Addison County was added to the disaster declaration due to the severe storms, flooding, landslides, and mudslides occurring July 7-17, 2023. Businesses and homeowners that suffered physical damage or economic injury are eligible for Business Physical Disaster Loans, Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL), and Home Disaster Loans.

Submit Projects for Annual Regional Priority Project List

Each year, the Addison County Economic Development Corporation (ACEDC) solicits projects for the Regional Priority Project List. The projects can be municipal infrastructure projects, other municipal projects, and projects planned by nonprofits and businesses. The list is prioritized by a team including ACRPC and the top 10 projects are submitted to state and federal funders, such as NBRC, and may be used as part of their scoring processes. ACEDC is now accepting projects to be included in the 2023 Regional Priority Project List. Projects should be shovel ready, or close to shovel ready, and be seeking funding from multiple sources, but have a funding gap remaining. Emergency Management

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)

The HMGP program is funded through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and is administered by Vermont Emergency Management on behalf of the state. Typically, federal funds are available to cover up to 75% of approved project costs; and there is a 25% local match requirement that is the responsibility of the applicant town. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis **as funding is available**. HMGP applications **must be completed in their entirety**, including maps, list of alternative proposals, engineering plans, hydrology studies (if needed) and a full benefit-cost analysis (BCA) in the FEMA-approved format, if applicable.

AARP VT Livable Community Program - Winter Placemaking

AARP Vermont's 2023 Winter Placemaking Grants will provide financial support to non-profit or other ad-hoc groups, which meet the eligibility requirements, and that are also focused on reinventing a space that improves the safety, accessibility and overall appeal and are either temporary or permanent projects. The Placemaking Project is intended to inspire and educate community leaders and residents in their aim to have a positive impact on older adults living in your community. Bylaw Modernization Grants

In fiscal year 2024 (July 1, 2023– June 30, 2024), the Vermont Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) has funding to grant to municipalities for land use, development, and zoning bylaw updates in support of a pedestrian-oriented development pattern that increase housing choice, affordability, and opportunity in areas planned in accordance with Vermont's smart growth principles. This funding is intended to help municipalities confront the State's housing shortage and ready areas for new housing investments. Municipalities may submit an individual application for a maximum of \$25,000 or apply with other municipalities as part of a multi-town application, which are eligible for grants of up to a \$60,000 maximum. Bylaw Modernization Grant projects must be completed within 24 months. The grant term will be January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2025. Municipal Energy Resilience Program

Established by Act 172,the Municipal Energy Resilience Program (MERP) will provide \$45M in funding to help reduce municipal building energy usage, operating costs, and greenhouse gas emissions. Weatherization Repayment Assistance Program

WRAP will allow Vermont households to pay for qualifying weatherization projects like insulation and air sealing as well as heat pumps and advanced wood heating systems through a monthly charge on their utility bill that can be paid back over time. DEC Water Quality Project Development Block Grants

ACRPC is administering a 2022 Environmental Conservation (DEC) Project Development Block Grant to subgrant up to \$34,000 to develop water quality improvement projects. Funds should be used for getting landowners, municipalities and other partners "on board" with projects to improve water quality and to move those projects towards design and implementation. VLR Rivers and Roads Training Program - Rivers & Roads Tier 2 - October 11-12

Tier Two of the Rivers and Roads Training Program targets a wide range of state, municipal and private sector transportation infrastructure. Participants leave the training with the knowledge and skills required to distinguish between stable and unstable rivers, identify various types of river instability, forecast a rivers response to alternative structural treatments and build those treatments. Tier 2 is a two-day training and is both indoors and outdoors. Bring, or wear, appropriate field clothes and waterproof boots or old sneakers you can get wet! Each day will be indoors for slideshows, class exercises, and river flume table demonstrations and outdoors on rivers and streams to observe in the field what we've seen and discussed indoors.

VT F&W Community Wildlife Program - Better Zoning to Prevent Forest Fragmentation Webinar

Vermont's increasing demand for housing and love of our forests is an opportunity to rethink the relationship between development and conservation. Providing housing for those who need it most while maintaining a connected, intact, and diverse ecosystem requires strategic land use planning at the town and regional level. Zoning can steer development into downtown, village, and growth centers and prevent forest fragmentation in rural areas. Towns that have redrawn their zoning lines and adapted development standards have successfully conserved large forest blocks and maintained wildlife connectivity across boundaries. The VT Fish & Wildlife's Community Wildlife Program has partnered with the Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission's Senior Planner, Darren Schibler, for a deeper understanding of zoning in our state's fastest growing county.
