2026-06-08 Walk Bike Council Meeting

Present: Laura Asermily, Susan Shashok, Danelle Birong (ACRPC); Online: Doug McCain, David Pistilli, Nate Burt, Jef Bratspis, Erik Remson, Jack Evans (Local Motion), Craig Stevens (DoH), Larry Buck, Tim Clark

Laura kicked off the meeting with a conversation regarding Communications. **As a reminder, if you have an event, you can email Google Group email walkbikeacvt@googlegroups.com.** If you have an event that you want promoted, share yourself via the email address. And/or send information to Susan for posting to Instagram and can add to Event calendar. Google group glitch discussion ensued with Jack and remedied. If there are future issues, discuss with /send screenshot to Jack. Nate suggested to check your personal settings.

Infrastructure and Project Review:

- Middlebury

- **South Street Storm and Wastewater Project** - David Pistilli noted that the will not be happening this year – so that paving and traffic calming measures envisioned will continue to be on hold.
- **Washington Street Extension** – Laura noted that the Colonial Drive to 5 Corners is not in good shape
- Laura also noted line striping stopped. David shared there is a lack of resources at DPW.

Culture Shift and Marketing:

- RideGPS

- Danelle and Susan met and determined that the cost (\$60/year) is not warranted as that membership would not allow the Council to gather the information of interest/feedback for Vtrans the feedback we

were hoping to get. Users would not be able to add information about areas of concerns. Need proof of concept – and maybe a Group Account can be considered in the future.

- Susan is meeting with Nate Burt and Tim Clark to discuss promoting the **Triangle Bike Loop** with tools on hand (personal RideGPS accounts) to come up with simple plan this season and then possibly expand over the winter. Susan is grateful for the additional assistance from these council members.
- **Triangle Loop Detours** – Doug discussed options: Rt 17 (not ideal), Sawyer Road. Nate added warning on RideGPS about that section which is posted to the website.

- **Social Media**

- Send photo and a quick blurb of text to Susan and she can post on **Instagram**.
- Tim and Susan will be meeting to cross-promote **Facebook** and Instagram content.
- Danelle reminded the group to gather info from other communities and **promote the County**. Maybe a series of messages walk/bike messages to feel more county-wide versus town specific.

- **Tri-Valley Transit Cross-Promotion**

- Larry Buck is on the TVT Board, and it was discussed at the last meeting to share promotional materials / literature. TVT wants to communicate to riders at bus stops about where they can park bikes, etc. Danelle and Laura volunteered to assist with transfer of information – Larry to connect us. Danelle to follow up with Adam Lougee as he is the chair.
- Laura noted that TVT information and its programs are listed on our website.

- **Department of Health** - Craig shared that he and Jack made a connection after the last meeting. Craig shared the following initiatives:

- “Askable Adult” – 2 hour training research shows meaningful connections with committed adults in one of most important factors in building resilient relationships
- Medical Go Bags with AgeWell
- Craig would like to know what activities are coming up – as he has learned to go where the people are. He would like to have something more structured – let him know the audience, key players, etc – and DoH can see how they fit in.
- Possibly in the works – Children’s bike helmets for \$9
- Halloween downtown events – good opportunity for reflector programs

Citizen and School Engagement:

- **Middlebury (Mary Hogan)** - Eric Remson shared that Middlebury wrapped up the last Walk and Roll day (Safe Routes to School). 50 bikes on the racks on the last day. Walkers get counted in the fall and the spring. Instead of little prizes, the students had punch cards this year and they could qualify for a “Treat Card” from Shiretown for a free creemee. 140 students qualified. Punch cards have proven to be a good system.
- Laura reminded the team that she and Eric can assist with sharing what Middlebury does with **other towns/schools**.
- Kathy reported (via email) that 19 women completed the **Wellness Revolution** program.
- **Slow Roller** rides from Middlebury are consistent and really fun.
- **Walking groups?** Not yet but hoping some can be formed.

2026-05-11 Walk Bike Council Meeting

Meeting was kicked off with a round of Introductions for new faces. Katie Langrock has served on the board of Local Motion for many years and assisted with hiring of the most recent Executive Director. Samuel Robertson, a graduating senior of Middlebury College, joined as he recently presented his senior thesis "Middlebury's Unplanned Pedestrian Paths" at the 2026 Walk Bike Summit.

Walk Bike Summit participants provided overview of their experience and sessions they attended. [Mark Fenton](#) was the inspiring Keynote speaker.

Infrastructure and Project Review:

- **Countywide** - Bike racks and bike parking improvements needed throughout the county.
- **Middlebury** - Review Samuel's thesis for information regarding connecting the campus to adjacent neighborhoods regarding unplanned pedestrian paths.
- **Middlebury** - Transit-Oriented Development (TODs) grant – working with ARPC / CCRPC - focusing on area near the Amtrak Station. Last week, the contractors presented their final project sketch for what they suggest for that area and will soon be sharing language to add to the Zoning regulations for that area for Middlebury to be considered once the Town Plan has been updated.
- **Ferrisburgh-Vergennes** - Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) grant – Danelle shared this grant/ project also existed for the area around the Amtrak Station.
- **Walking Audits** – [More information](#) – Important to include town leadership in these walks. Laura attended one with Mark Fenton, the keynote speaker noted above.
- **Quick Build Infrastructure** – more affordable and often temporary infrastructure that helps test designs, gather public feedback, constructed quickly with low-cost durable materials (paint, planters, etc) instead of heavy construction. Local Motion has also worked on some of these style projects.

Municipal and Agency Outreach:

- **E-bikes vs e-moto education**- It was suggested to educate municipalities and schools on e-bikes vs e-moto. Local Motion is working on something for schools, and they also have the following info on their website – [click here](#).

Culture Shift and Marketing:

- **Website** – Susan has spent time re-organizing information and added more pertinent information. Val at Local Motion will assist with getting rid of footer (links to them, not us)
- **Google group** – Susan removed all “pending “emails from the system as they technically declined to join.
- **Instagram** – See link at top of page to view the new Instagram page.
- **MyGps app** – Infrastructure and safety changes on the Triangle Bike Loop will be noted. Danelle is still working on getting Vtrans blessing.

Citizen and School Engagement:

- A lot going on this month (May) with Bike Month (and also Walk Month too).
- **E-bikes vs e-moto education**- It was suggested to educate municipalities and schools on e-bikes vs e-moto. Local Motion is working on something for schools, and they also have the following info on their website – [click here](#). (Duplicated from Municipal and Agency Outreach)
- **Increasing Engagement Brainstorming**– Laura has written letters to the Addison Independent and Eric gets info in the Addy Indy for specific events, but these are not necessarily connected to the WBCAC and often Middlebury-focused. What else can we do???
 - o **Collab with Dept of Health** - Craig reported that the DoH recently offered 1 event with a school (Addison County NW) and they did a video and panel speaking on truancy, but the root was isolation and loneliness for rural young men. 50-60 individuals attended. 2 or so weeks ago, they hosted a movie “Ramen Day” and panel regarding food insecurity at the Middlebury Marquis. **Maybe VDH can partner with WBCAC to bring folks together that are interested in a new topic.**
 - o Create a traveling pop-up station (like what Laura currently does) that can be shared with all communities.
 - o Craig also shared the following **key films and projects regarding walking/biking in Vermont** include: (maybe use these as promotion items to get conversations going?)
 - [Best Day Ever](#) (2025): Focuses on adaptive mountain biking and community in the Green Mountains.
 - [There From Here](#) (2024): A documentary chronicling a 640-mile bike route through rural Vermont.
 - [From Rails to Trails](#) (2025): Features the Island Line Trail and the movement to convert abandoned railways into walking/cycling paths.
 - [Ritual Mountain Bike Film Tour](#): Screened in Burlington, highlighting trail riding in Vermont.

Infrastructure and Project Review:

- **Middlebury** – Danelle mentioned she met with Middlebury Public Works Engineer, Emmalee Cherrington, for another reason, but asked a few questions about infrastructure concerns raised previously. (See March notes below). Good news, the Exchange Street multi-use path went out to bid last week. She is aware of other areas of concern noted.
- **Transportation Advisory Council (TAC)** - Laura noted to the team that she is a Midd rep on the ACRPC TAC where she speaks on behalf of Walk-Bike concerns.

- **Triangle Bike Route** –
 - o Doug noted that a bridge will be closed on Plank Road in August. Ride with GPS is “supposed to” update when there are closed roads. When we know more, adding something to website will be wise.
 - o Plank Road – Kathy has concerns about promoting the Triangle Bike loop due to the fact it needs to be regraded for road bikes. Will it be re-graded? Laura suggested adding a note about this in Ride GPS.
 - o Does the route need to be re-visited? Rt 17? But is that a good option?

Municipal and Agency Outreach:

- No new updates, except **connecting with Rec Groups** in other towns to become part of this group.

Culture Shift and Marketing:

- **Instagram**- The group now has an instagram page thanks to Susan. @walkbikecounciladdisoncounty
- **Website**- It has been updated with so much information (but still a work in progress) and now has a **calendar of events** that can be shared. <https://www.walkbikeaddison.org/events> which includes all events previously shared via email by Laura. Susan also reported that she found the google calendar account/access with the help of Local Motion. List of council members may be outdated. Laura will work with Susan to update. She also walked us through new/ updated content. Regarding **MyRidewithGPS app**, to include rides on the website, Danelle reported that she is still waiting to hear if VTrans (new contact at the state) allows the \$60/year fee.
- **Email Distribution list** – discussion ensued regarding old/pending email addresses, and it was determined (via Jack) they were likely outdated / softly unsubscribing so delete them. Jack previously followed up with these.
- **Addison Independent** - Column? Still an idea...
- **Front Porch Forum** - ACRPC can and will include a Walk Bike communication the week of April 13th to every town promoting the Council and Walk Bike Summit in Bennington on May 8th.
- **New events** - Communicate with Susan if you have an event to add via info@walkbikeaddison.org.
- **Google email list** - walkbikeacvt@google groups.com. Anyone can use this list to email, reply, etc.

Citizen and School Engagement:

- **Bike School Training at Mary Hogan:** Laura gave update regarding Bike School Training at Mary Hogan. She provided little swag bags for students. One day there were 40 bikes (typical of walk and ride to school), then 60, then 80 bikes. Phenomenal numbers. Efforts to mobilize kids to bike makes a great difference.
- **Swag** - Laura also has a bunch of **marketing materials and swag for Middlebury**. If anyone is looking to do outreach event, coordinate with Laura.
- **E-Bikes** - Kathy inquired about getting **Ebikes in Vergennes and Bristol**, to extend this outreach outside of Middlebury. Eric provided history which was a Local Motion Grant, and Middlebury was chosen as a grant recipient which paid for the e-bikes. Then partnership was set up between Frog Hollow (store. Maintain, train) and the Ilsley Library (check in and out). The maintenance of bikes is paid for from funds from Middlebury-specific Walk-Bike fundraising. Jack chimed in regarding grant opportunities such as **AARP grant**, and Local Motion is happy to help. There may be road blocks, but Kathy thinks they can be overcome. Kathy also mentioned that she is talking with Tim from Little City Cycles to bring similar events (e.g. bike swap) to Vergennes.
- **Swag for Vergennes and Bristol** – Need funds. Middlebury Safe Routes had some remaining money from Bike Swaps and e-bike program which fund the Middlebury swag.
- **In-school advocate** – Laura suggested this for Vergennes, Ferrisburgh, Bristol. Tim suggested getting someone from the schools to join our meetings. Kathy will also connect with Robin Newton, Vergennes, as she brings the Local Motion bikes to school, etc. **Laura volunteered to go to Vergennes** to get the word out, assist with event, etc. Tim is happy to assist with E-bikes if/when we get them in via a grant.
- **ACRPC E-bikes** – Unfortunately, they are only available for staff due to insurance.

Upcoming Events:

- **May is National Bike Month and National Walk Month.**

- In **Middlebury, Bike Month kicks off with the Bike Swap on May 2nd**. PR in place, Carl will connect with volunteers from past years. Rain or shine event. Conversation ensued re: RAD (Adaptive Bikes) and Carl will follow up with them. Laura would like to do E-Bike demos from library. It requires 2 volunteers, and needs a safe path to test ride. Laura discussed the need and access to helmets, and the team discussed with a Hold harmless Waiver for signature. Laura said there is a model form available. One discussed route is: down Mill Street and come back on Weybridge Street. Or maybe a guided ride?
- **Cool Motion, Bristol** is also holding a Bike Swap. **Saturday, April 25th**
- **New online events webpage** - All events have been posted to <https://www.walkbikeaddison.org/events>. Communicate with Susan **if you have an event to add**.
- **Vermont Walk Bike Summit** – ACRPC offered funds to cover registration for Summit in Bennington, May 8th. Kathy and Laura showed interest.
- **Cinco de Mayo ride** - Kathy will likely plan a ride. She is in touch with Ryan Denecker to be able to park in lot on corner of Rt 7/Monkton rd.
- **Mountain Bike Club** – trail maintenance starting in Bristol.
- **Wellness Revolution** –Kathy said 6-8 spaces remaining as of 4/13.
- **Slow Roller rides** - in Middlebury start at end of April.

Laura greeted the group and welcomed everyone back for 2026. The focus of this meeting was to focus on how things are going, what the groups wishes may be for this new year, and a recap as to how the group began. The group then introduced themselves and shared their history, why they are on the council, and/or what is important to them.

Laura was a founding member, along with some others on the meeting call. Previously very Middlebury-centric as that was the origination of a larger group, but the intent is it to be county-wide. Laura is also a member of the Transportation Advisory Council (TAC) with the ACRPC focusing on infrastructure and project review. Laura walked the group through the website, www.walkbikeaddison.org, the mission statement; various pages of information including the four “Working Groups” created at inception. 1) Infrastructure and Project Review, 2) Municipal Outreach and Advocacy, 3) Culture Shift and Marketing, 4) Citizen and School Engagement; and Triangle Bike Loop map.

Round Robin of attendees– What has been going on, and what are you are hoping for in 2026.

Sally – **Bristol Bike Pedestrian group** met a few weeks ago and there is new energy in the group. She is excited to get this Bristol group going again!

Nate – Thanks Adam and Laura for all that they do! Looking forward to Bike training at Mary Hogan in the spring. There may be additional spaces if others wish to volunteer. Grateful for the new sidewalk near the Pulp Mill Covered Bridge.

Susan – Has served on many different groups and committees in Middlebury - Infrastructure, Select Board, Parks and Rec – and has worked on lots of projects including the sidewalk Nate mentioned. Very experienced cyclist. Her first Walk Bike meeting was September and is excited to join this group. Susan stated she has experience with websites, working on projects, and happy to offer assistance when needed.

Kathy – Joined the Council last year when she was involved with the Vergennes Rec Committee. She is very interested in getting people on bikes, be more confident on bikes, urban biking. For 4 years she has led a

women's wellness 3-week bike group via BCBS/Terry Bikes. She works closely with Tim Mathewson, Little City Cycles. She also tried to get Ferrisburgh Central School to start doing their own Walk and Roll. Vergennes Elementary has a Bike Trailer that comes in May to get new riders on bikes. Kathy also inquired about the "status" of this group as she noticed **the Donate Button** on the website. Jack confirmed that the funds would go through Local Motion but is earmarked for Walk Bike Council of Addison County. **Jack will get back to the group with the balance in that account.**

Doug- considers himself a recreational cyclist. His main focus for the last couple of years was getting the triangle bike loop put together. He still gets outside in the winter – primarily walking.

Tim – has been on the council for a long time. Ge tries to maintain the groups **Facebook page**, and worked on getting photos of rides to post. He rides a lot, especially the part of the triangle loop towards Vergennes and Waltham. Kathy and Tim started out strong last year to get rides going, but he is realizing it's difficult to be the driving force behind projects, prefers to be part of a team due to time constraints. Tim has a mailing list that can be used – maybe Vergennes specific. Tim mentioned forming a **Vergennes version of the Bristol Group**. The rides that Kathy and Tim have spearheaded have been more focused near the lake, versus Maple and Green which can be difficult.

Lauren – This is her first meeting! She hosts **Wednesday night Slow Rollers bike rides** in the nice weather. Social bike club, go up to 15 miles. She led 95% of rides last year, and others are looking to lead rides well. They have had 6-22 people – lots of interest, including people from outside of Middlebury – Vergennes, Bristol, etc. They also try to pair with a business to stop in. For example, Lincoln Peak Vineyard stayed open later for them. Open to doing rides in Vergennes as well. Also, an avid Middlebury walker with her children and is grateful for flags, painted lines, etc – but also realizes a lot of work needs to be done noting the intersections nearest Greg's Meat Market.

David – Recreational biker. A "systems guy" - motivated by wanting to improve systemically what we do. So much effort into so many different causes – biking and pedestrian safety being one of them – Recognizes how important it is to build in improvements into our transportation system so that they are realized. He is interested in making things happen!

Adam - one of the founding members of the Walk Bike Council in 2015 and chaired it for 6-8 years. He joined the meeting to see how things are going and to assist with any historical context.

Eric – He's been with the Walk Bike Council for 5-6 years. He coordinates Middlebury safe routes and the walk and roll days that are held every month at Mary Hogan, sits on the Middlebury infrastructure committee, and currently is the chair of the town's Planning Commission. These are a few of the ways he is working to improve and increase walking and biking in the area.

Larry – he worked on the Triangle Bike Look with Doug McCain. No longer riding on asphalt due to being clipped by a car. He started up a program **at Rikert Ski Center- fat trike program**. Would love to have more improvements made to Triangle Bike loop, but state funds are likely not available. His energy really is in that **the adaptive bike program** – good for those that are losing their balance and can't ride a 2-wheel bike anymore – great to get outside in the winter. He advocates for two wheeled fat bikes or three wheeled adaptive trikes, and to try it out in a safe area such as Rikert.

Danelle (ACRPC) – Recapped that she took on the ACRPC role at the beginning of 2025. She brought up the TAC again, reminding folks how important it is for all communities to be part of this so that they can have their voices (and potential projects) heard. Perfect example for Larry's concerns with the Triangle Loop. She also shared the Draft Regional Plan and noted the Transportation Chapter about Walk Bike Council. There are also associated goals and actions. The first of two public hearings on the Draft Regional Plan is in April. <https://acrpc.org/regional-plan-2026/> We welcome all comments and hearing from our community. Transportation Section and Appendix include action items. Larry asked that she send out the link in an email, which she agreed to do. The goal, and my task from ACRPC, is to focus on implementing items in the plan once approved. She is available to discuss in more detail.

Jack (Local Motion) – Local Motion's role is to allow this group to do for the people here to do the work without having to run into as much headache/ Lowering barriers, helping get research, and technical assistance.

Laura addressed the group and is very excited for as much walking and biking as possible. She also mentioned our Partner in Tri-Valley Transit – and more than just busses. She has been in touch with Mary Claire, their community Manager, started Social Bus rides. Similar to Slow Rollers but on a bus.

Maybe there would be greater impact if names of programs were aligned– ex: using Slow Rollers which could also include busses. Good way to promote alternatives to single occupant cars.

So much great information available. Connectingcommuters.com. All resources on Local Motion's website.

Also Laura plans to focus on **e-bike education**. Maybe an event at the Middlebury Bike Swap. Or Middlebury Car show again. **Adaptive bikes** are also important – maybe a workshop for adults. Middlebury will have a trailer in April and maybe there is an opportunity to do something around education for adults with bikes at that time. She also always pays attention crosswalks and intersections, and the languishing Exchange St. multi-use path. Larry also encouraged Laura to connect **Rad innovations** down in Cornwall for **electric bikes and electric adapter bikes**, and they could bring their van to your gatherings in Middlebury and show people what electric bikes are and electric trikes are.

Lauren mentioned if any other towns or any other groups are interested in starting slow rollers chapters. **Reach out to James at Analog Cycles** and he has a whole blog with all information about how to start your own chapter. Larry mentioned being sure Bristol Rec committee is aware.

Danelle noted that there were so many dates and events that are upcoming. Maybe we can put together a list or calendar that can be posted. Danelle would be happy to create that list if all communities shared upcoming information. Erik currently maintains the event page – but may be limiting or may be a long scroll to get to the date. Discussion ensued how to best present information. Laura shared that Susan and Eric are working on the website – and Danelle volunteered to assist if needed. Larry brought up the Addy Indy and discussion ensued about how to get important events in the paper, such as the Activity Guide.

If folks want events included in the **Summer Activity guide**, send to Erik. Deadline has passed for Spring Activity guide.

Maybe we can get a regular column or a diary page (blog?). Or small ads. And Tim mentioned posting on PPF as well as an important source of information.

Laura suggested a publicity team. Laura volunteered for such and others. Connect directly with Addy Indy for an article/story. Similar to Larry's experience with the Rikert program.

Great energy. Let's keep it up!
