

OVERVIEW

The Addison County Regional Planning Commission (ACRPC) is an association of towns, formed in 1967, to provide vision, guidance, and planning services to the Addison Region. Other specific duties include: technical assistance to municipalities, providing a forum for municipalities to discuss and resolve mutual concerns, serving as a central repository of data and planning resources, and preparing and maintaining a regional land use plan. *Examples of specific services:*
